1. ANNOUNCEMENT:

The **RRAT**, hereafter called the PROMOTING CLUB will conduct Closed to Club Day 2018 Closed to Club Road Racing/Historic Road Racing/Supermoto Championship Series for Juniors and Seniors, Regularity events will form part of this meeting hereafter referred to as track day class, at Suncity Raceway, Shaw Road, The Bohle as per Permit Applications applied for.

2. JURISDICTION:

- 2.1. The abovementioned meeting has been authorised by MQ who has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number AS ABOVE and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia National Snr, Jnr Licences and One Meeting Licences (OML to junior riders if they hold a current JCP Log Book), who are full financial members of the Promoting Club. Juniors must produce a current log book.
- 2.2. The meeting will be held in accordance with the current Manual of Motorcycle Sport General Competition Rules (GCR's), these Supplementary Regulations, and any Final Instructions approved by MQ.

BY ENTERING THIS MEETING ALL PARTIES AGREE TO COMPLY WITH THESE RULES, REGULATIONS, BY-LAWS AND INSTRUCTIONS.

3. ENTRIES:

- 3.1. Entries open forthwith, late entries may be accepted on the day at the discretion of the Clerk of Course, however a \$50.00 **late fee applies**. No late entries will be accepted once Riders' Briefing has commenced. New members and track day excepted.
- 3.2. In the case of postponement or abandonment of the meeting, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by the Club, if such retention is approved by MQ.
- 3.3. Preferred method of entry is Ridernet. And the entry form attached that is accompanied by the correct fee will be accepted at nominations@rrat.com.au Please see the entry form for bank details, you must use your name as a reference, the onus of proof of payment lies with the competitor.
- 3.4. Nomination fee of \$90.00 for all Snr classes. Endorsed juniors racing in a senior class will be the \$90.00 fee.
- 3.5. Sidecar \$100.00
- 3.6. Nomination fee of \$75.00 for all junior only classes.
- 3.7. Entry into second and subsequent senior or junior class or classes by the same competitor is \$10.00 payable once only.
- 3.8. Family Nomination fee discount - maximum of \$30 off combined nomination costs if 2 or more Riders from a family have nominated and participate in meeting. Members who domicile more than 200kms from the circuit, will be provided a discounted nomination fee for seniors of \$80.00. Juniors \$65.00. Only one discount will be applicable per nomination.
- 3.9. These discounts will be applied on the day in cash back: once proof of eligibility has been viewed.
- 3.10. DO NOT send cash in the mail.

4. INSURANCE:

- 4.1. National Personal Accident Scheme provides basic cover for death and permanent disability.
- 4.2. Ambulance Insurance is compulsory for licensees.

4.3. IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT COMPETITORS CONSIDER TAKING OUT WEEKLY BENEFITS INSURANCE.

8 AWARDS AND PRIZEMONEY:

- 8.1 Ribbons will be awarded for: 1st, 2nd and 3rd for all senior classes in each round.
- 8.2 Trophies for 1st, 2nd & 3rd in the Junior Corporate Challenge will be awarded at each round.
- 8.3 No other trophies or prize money will be awarded at these meetings.
- 8.4 With all points counting to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place trophies, for senior and junior across all classes to be awarded at series end.

9 ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS:

- 9.1. To constitute a Class, the number of contestants entered and competing in each Class shall be four.
- 9.2 Any race that has less than 4 remaining competitors may be combined with another class & scored separately for their respective class points.
- 9.3 Should there be insufficient entries in any Class of Competition, the decision to run or cancel the Class, or to combine events and re-distribute any awards, will be at the discretion of the club, subject to MQ approval.

11 RACE FORMAT:

- 11.1 Solo classes shall compete in 1 x 10 lap sprint race, 1 x 8 lap sprint race and 1 x 6 lap sprint race.
- 11.2 Sidecars shall compete in 4 sprint races of 5 laps.
- 11.3 All classes – 1 warm up lap per race.
- 11.4 Formula RR/Supersingle combined and scored separately – limited to 24 grid positions.
- 11.5 Track day class – refer to Clause 21
- 11.6 Event Order will be confirmed in Final Instructions

12 MACHINES AND RIDERS:

- 12.1. All machines entered must comply with the current GCR's for RR, Historic RR & Supermoto competition.
- 12.2. As a track requirement, all motorcycles must be fitted with folding or shear type footrests. Supermoto machines must be fitted with peg sliders.
- 12.3. Multiple entry of the one Machine in the same Class of Competition is not permitted.
- 12.4. Each rider must present their protective clothing as per the current GCRs to the Scrutineer at the same time as machinery to be examined.
- 12.5. Any competitor involved in an accident must represent their machine and full riding gear to the Scrutineer for inspection and clearance before participating in their next event.
- 12.6. A substitute machine may be permitted subject to the approval of the Steward. Substitution request must be submitted in writing to the Clerk of the Course at least ten minutes prior to the start of the race in which the substitution is requested.
- 12.7. Substitute machines must have passed machine examination, must be eligible for the class and replace a machine that cannot be reasonably repaired.
- 12.8. Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their preferred competition number. All others will be allocated numbers at the Promoter's discretion.
- 12.9. All Number Plates on all Machines MUST comply with the GCR's.
- 12.10. As Per GCR. The only liquid coolants permitted are water and non-glycol coolants. Glycol and coolants manufactured with glycol are not allowed.

13 GRID POSITIONS:

- 13.1. Grid positions for each class will be determined by a single qualifying session for the first heat of each round. Grid positions for subsequent heats will be the finishing order from the previous heat.

14 RIDERS BRIEFING:

- 14.1. Riders Briefing will be held prior to the commencement of the event and ALL competitors, parents/guardians MUST attend.

15 DRUG AND OR ALCOHOL TESTING:

- 15.1. All competitors and officials are advised that as part of the MA drug education program, drug testing may take place at any competition in accordance with Australian Sports Commission policy as implemented by the Australian Sports Drug Agency.
- 15.2. If any doubts exist over banned substances it is recommended competitors telephone the Drugs in Sport Hotline 1800 020506. When drug testing takes place, the payment of prizemoney may be delayed at MQ discretion until the results of the tests are known. For the purposes of drug & alcohol testing, the commencement of the meeting will be deemed to be 10.30 am with the completion of the meeting for the participant being when the participant has vacated the venue.

16 CODE OF CONDUCT:

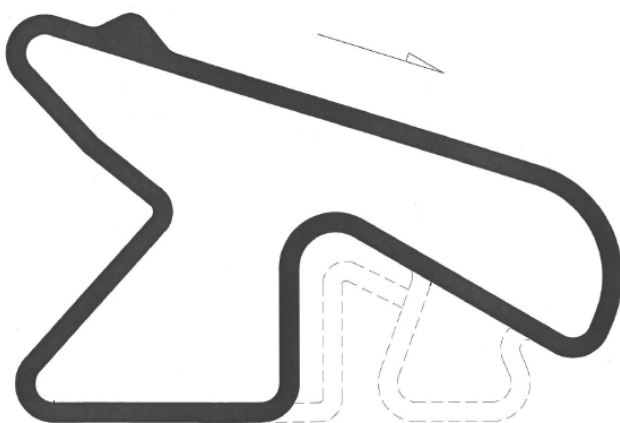
- 16.1. All Competitors, Officials and Parents are reminded of the Motorcycling Australia By-Law - CODE OF CONDUCT (as stipulated in the GCR's) which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all Motorcycle Race Meetings. This CODE OF CONDUCT applies to this Meeting and will be enforced.

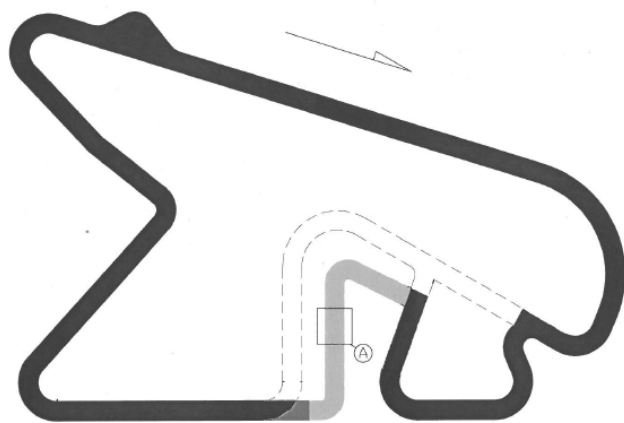

18 CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION:

- 18.1 Road Race – clockwise 950 metre asphalt track.
- 18.2 Supermoto - clockwise 1050 metre combined asphalt/decomposed track.

19. RACE STARTS:

19.1 Races will start by flag and/or lights.

19.2 Regularity will start from track entry. NO RACE STARTS for this class.

20 SPECIAL NOTES AND WARNINGS:

20.1 Competition One Meeting Licences are available on the day for \$90.00 (GST included).

20.2 No dogs are allowed with the exception of assistance dogs. No alcohol or smoking is permitted in the pit area.

20.3 All persons in the pit area must be wearing enclosed footwear. Riders are responsible for their crew members / friends / family etc.

20.4 Persons operating a motorcycle or other competition machine must be wearing a helmet, regardless of location at venue.

20.5 Persons operating other vehicles must be appropriately licenced to do so.

20.6 No bicycles, skateboards, roller skates etc. are allowed in the pit area.

20.7 Food and Drinks may be available onsite.

20.8 Children must be supervised by a responsible adult at all times.

20.9 Final instructions will be issued and available at www.rrat.com.au & RRAT Facebook no later than 5 days before meeting date.

20.10 Burnouts on the track or in the dummy grid will not be tolerated, and will result in a penalty.

20.11 Victory or showboat wheel-stands will not be tolerated and will result in a penalty.

20.12 The Race Secretary may compete at this meeting provided that:

A) A second suitably qualified Race Secretary is appointed to the meeting:

B) At all times during the meeting, one of the Race Secretaries will be on duty, and:

C) The Clerk of Course has given permission for this to occur in accordance with current relevant GCR.

21. TRACK DAY (REGULARITY) EVENT

21.1: The event is open to participants aged 18 years and older, who hold a motorcycle licence, and are financial members of RRAT.

21.2 Participants may join the Club on the day.

21.3 Motorcycles do not need to be road registered.

21.4 Race competitors may enter this event, however machines used in this event cannot be entered in a race event at this meeting.

21.5 All machines must pass scrutineering prior to participation.

21.6 Machines must have mirrors removed, headlights & indicators taped & side stands secured.

21.7 Road registered machines must have the number plates & registration sticker covered or removed.

21.8 Participants must wear sturdy clothing, jeans, jacket, boots, gloves and a MA approved helmet in good condition.

21.9 Machines "do not" require a race number as each machine will be fitted with a timing transmitter to record all lap times. No other form of timing may be carried on the machine & the speedo & tachometer must be covered.

21.10 Four sessions of approximately 10 minutes duration **on the bitumen circuit only** will be conducted.

21.11 The participant who has a lowest differential between their fastest & slowest lap times over the 4 sessions will be declared the winner. To be eligible to win this event you must participate in all 4 sessions.

21.12 Entry fee is \$120.00 per machine, your ROAD LICENCE will be held as security against your transponder.

21.13 Transponder holders will be supplied to all competitors & must be returned - with the transponder - at end of event.

21.14 Each participant will be issued with a "Single Use Recreational Activity Licence" (this is included in the Entry Fee)

21.15 Participants will be limited to 24 persons - priority entry given to persons not otherwise participating in the meeting.

21.16 All participants must -

a) Complete an Entry Form

b) Attend the Rider's Briefing

c) Comply with any / all directions of meeting officials

21.17 Race like behaviour/aggressive passing/wheel-stands & other showboating will result in exclusion from the event.

CONTRACT TO PARTICIPATE IN RRAT CLOSED TO CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS

WARNING! THIS IS AN IMPORTANT DOCUMENT WHICH AFFECTS YOUR LEGAL RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS, PLEASE READ IT CAREFULLY AND DO NOT SIGN IT UNLESS YOU ARE SATISFIED YOU UNDERSTAND IT.

1. I THE UNDERSIGNED

HEREBY AGREE with Motorcycling Australia Limited ("MA") that I am by this agreement entitled to participate in the motorcycle activity/meeting listed in Schedule 2 (hereinafter called "the Meeting" or the "Event") at the venue listed at Schedule 3 (hereinafter called "the Venue") on the terms and conditions set out in this document.

2. DEFINITIONS In this declaration:

- a) "Claim" means and includes any action, suit, proceeding, claim, demand, damage, cost or expense however arising including but not limited to negligence but does not include a claim against a Motorcycling Organisation under any right expressly conferred by its constitution or regulation;
- b) "Indemnitees" means and includes the persons, organisations and bodies corporate whose names appear in Schedule 1.
- c) "MA" means Motorcycling Australia Limited;
- d) "State Controlling Body" (SCB) means a state or territory motorcycling association affiliated as a member of MA;
- e) "Motorcycling Activities" means performing or participating in any capacity in any authorised or recognised Motorcycling Organisation event, meeting or activity;
- f) "Motorcycling Organisation" means and includes MA, and the MA members (including the SCBs and affiliated clubs) and where the context so permits, their respective directors, officers, members, servants or agents.

3. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISKS, DANGERS & OBLIGATIONS

I ACKNOWLEDGE that:

- a) motorcycle sport is dangerous and that by engaging in the sport (whether as a competitor, recreational rider, coach, official or media) at the Meeting I take and am exposed to certain risks and dangers and am under certain obligations as follows:
 - i) that I may be injured, physically or mentally, and may be killed;
 - ii) that my machinery or equipment may be damaged, lost or destroyed;
 - iii) that competitors may ride dangerously or with a lack of skill;
 - iv) that track or event conditions may be hazardous and may vary without warning or predictability;
 - v) that organisers, officials, landowners/track operators and any agents or representatives of those in charge of meetings are frequently obliged to make decisions under pressure of time/or events;
 - vi) that any policy of insurance of or in respect of my life or physical or mental health may be voided;
 - vii) that there may be no or inadequate facilities for treatment or transport of me if I am injured;
 - viii) that I have an obligation to myself and to others to act safely and within the rules and regulations of MA;
- b) the Indemnitees do not make any warranty that the services at the Meeting will be provided with due care and skill or that any materials provided in connection with the services will be fit for the purpose for which they are supplied;
- c) to the extent that any warranty is implied it is excluded to the full extent permitted by law;
- d) have voluntarily read and understood this warning and accept and assume the inherent risks in participating in the Event.

4. WARNING UNDER THE FAIR TRADING ACT 1999 (VIC)

Under the provisions of the Fair Trading Act 1999 (Vic) several conditions are implied into contracts for the supply of certain goods and services. These conditions mean that the supplier named on this form is required to ensure that the recreational services it supplies to you are:
- rendered with due care and skill;
- as fit for the purpose for which they are commonly bought as it is reasonable to expect in the circumstances; and
- reasonably fit for any particular purpose or might reasonably be expected to achieve any result you have made known to the supplier.

Under section 32N of the Fair Trading Act 1999, the supplier is entitled to ask you to agree that these conditions do not apply to you. If you sign this form, you will be agreeing that your rights to sue the supplier under the Fair Trading Act 1999 if you are killed or injured because the services were not rendered with due care and skill or they were not reasonably fit for their purpose, are excluded, restricted or modified in the way set out in this form. **NOTE:** The change to your rights, as set out in this form, does not apply if your death or injury is due to gross negligence on the supplier's part. "Gross negligence" is defined in the Fair Trading (Recreational Services) Regulations 2004.

For the purposes of the clause 3, "the Supplier" shall mean and include the Indemnitees.

5. INDEMNITY AND RELEASE GIVEN TO ORGANISERS

IN CONSIDERATION of the acceptance of me as a participant in the Meeting:

- a) I AGREE TO INDEMNIFY AND KEEP INDEMNIFIED to the full extent permitted by law the Indemnitees and each of them in the following manner:
 - i) that I participate in the meeting at my sole risk and responsibility;
 - ii) that I accept the Venue as it stands with all or any defects hidden or exposed;
 - iii) that I indemnify and hold harmless the Indemnitees, their respective servants, agents, officials and competitors against any actions, costs, losses or claims which may be made by me or on my behalf for or in respect of or arising out of my death or any injury loss or damage caused to me or my equipment whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any other manner whatsoever.
- b) I AGREE TO RELEASE to the full extent permitted by law the Indemnitees and each of them from all liability to me for any claim, loss, damage, cost or expense (whether arising under statute, from negligence, personal injury, psychological trauma, death, property damage or infringement of third party rights or otherwise) that arises as a result of any act, matter or thing done, permitted or omitted to be done by me or which is in any way connected with my presence at or involvement in the Event.
- c) The release and indemnity provided by me in this declaration is in addition to, and will not in any way limit the application of, the conditions of sale attaching to tickets, conditions of entry, conditions of credentials or any other applicable terms or conditions in respect of the Event.
- d) A term of this release and indemnity will not apply where the term contravenes the law of the relevant jurisdiction under which any legal action is legitimately taken however such terms are severable and do not invalidate the remaining terms.

6. MEDICAL

I declare that I am and must continue to be medically and physically fit and able to participate in the Meeting. I will immediately notify MA in writing via my SCB of any change to my fitness and ability to participate. I understand and accept the Indemnitees will continue to rely upon this declaration as evidence of my fitness and ability to participate. I acknowledge and agree that if required, the Indemnitees (or any of them) may arrange medical or hospital treatment (including ambulance transportation) for me. I authorise such actions being taken by the Indemnitees and agree to meet all costs associated with such action. I understand it is compulsory for me to have ambulance insurance in some form and I accept responsibility for the cost of ambulance transportation, ambulance cover and further agree to maintain ambulance cover during the term of my license / membership.

7. PRIVACY

I hereby consent to the collection of my personal information by the Promoter/Event Organiser, MA and the SCB in connection with my involvement at the Event and the use and disclosure of my personal information by Event Organiser, and MA to other agencies and officials associated with the Event for the purposes of conducting and managing the Event. I understand that I may gain access to my personal information held by contacting MA at 147 Montague St, South Melbourne, Victoria, 3205. I understand that if I do not provide the personal information requested above that I may not be permitted to participate in the Event.

8. PERSONAL HEALTH INFORMATION

I hereby agree with MA and the SCB that in consideration for my participation in the Event that MA and the SCB may receive, collect, store and use personal health information about me in the manner set out below:

- a) I ACKNOWLEDGE that:
 - i) If I am injured, become ill or die at or following the Event the party listed at Item 8 in Schedule 1 in addition to any hospital at which I am treated (together "my Carers") will have health related information about me in their possession, power and control relating to me which is subject to obligations imposed by the Privacy Act ("my Information") and the Privacy Act is intended to protect my personal information;
 - ii) MA and my SCB wish to collect my Information for purposes that include their risk management programs, evaluating and improving the safety of MA and SCB events and of the Meeting organisers and

- facility providers of MA / SCB permitted events, and generally to reduce the risks to persons engaged in motorcycle sport; and
- It is reasonable for MA and my SCB to collect, store, use and disclose my Information in accordance with clause 11(a)(i) above and in the manner set out in clause 11(b).
- b) IN CONSIDERATION of my acceptance as an entrant in the Meeting I consent and agree that MA and my SCB:
 - i) may collect and store any of my Information, including obtain my Information from third parties including my Carers;
 - ii) may use any information collected in accordance with this clause for any purpose consistent with creating safer competition in motorcycle sport and events held by or in conjunction with MA, my SCB, or with an MA or SCB permit;
 - iii) may disclose my Information to third parties provided such disclosure is reasonably intended to be used for the purpose of improving safety at events held by or in conjunction with MA, or with an MA permit provided any such information is held by MA or my SCB in accordance with the MA Privacy Policy.
- c) I irrevocably authorise MA and my SCB and hereby appoint MA and my SCB as my lawful attorneys to collect from my Carers, and I hereby direct my Carers to provide to MA or my SCB upon request being made by MA or my SCB, any of my Information including but not limited to any information concerning any incident or event causing or contributing to or resulting from any injury, illness or death to me, the details of any diagnosis and prognosis provided to me by my Carers (or any party with the knowledge of any of my Carers), and any other matter to the knowledge of my Carers that might reasonably be considered to be requested by MA or my SCB for the purpose of improving safety at MA and SCB events.

9. POLICIES AND REGULATIONS

- a) I acknowledge, understand and agree that it is a condition of my participation in the Event that I agree to be bound by, and subject to, the rules, regulations and jurisdiction of MA as amended from time to time. Copies of all MA rules, policies and regulations are available by contacting the MA office.
- b) All participants are bound by the MA anti doping policy and thus understand they may be subject to drug testing. Testing conducted by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority (ASADA) is in accordance with the ASADA Act and the National Anti-Doping Scheme. This involves the taking of a sample (any human biological fluid or tissue whether alive or otherwise, or any human breath) for the purpose of detecting the use of a Prohibited Drug or Doping Method. Any participant infringing MA's policy or refusing a drug test may be disqualified or otherwise dealt with in accordance with the terms of the anti-doping policy.

10. RIGHT TO USE IMAGE

Right to Use Image: I acknowledge and consent to Photographs and electronic images (including, but not limited to, moving images) being taken of me during my participation in the Event.
